HADLEIGH COUNTRY PARK, TQ 799870

SATURDAY 22nd JANUARY 2011

DIRECTIONS:

From A13/A129/B1014 Roundabout: Head east along the A13 for 500m and turn right at the gap in the dual-carriageway (the gap is just after the traffic lights; you will need the right-hand lane). Return westwards for 100m then turn left into Chapel Lane. Follow brown and white tourist signs to the Country Park in 450m.

CAR PARK:

The Country Park car park is accessed near the end of Chapel Lane, Hadleigh, Benfleet, Essex, (N 51° 33'7", E00 36'0"). Essex County Council £2 car parking charge applies; please pay at the meter.

PUBLIC TRANSPORT Nearest main line station is at Leigh-on-Sea, a 3k walk passed Hadleigh Castle.

FACILITIES

Toilets are available in the car park.
Newly completed Iron Age roundhouse adjacent to the car park. Hadleigh Castle is a short walk from the car park; Salvation Army Tea Rooms can be found on the way to the Castle. Good views over the Thames Estuary including Canvey Island, Southend Pier and Dartford Bridge. This is a good opportunity for some hill training; adjacent to the area being used for the 2012 Mountain Biking event at the Olympics.

COURSES:

White (1.5k), Yellow (2k), Orange (2.5k), Green (4k), and Blue (6k).
Dogs welcome if under control.

MAP & TERRAIN

Map 1:5000 for shorter courses; 1:10,000 for longer ones.
Courses overprinted and maps bagged.
Terrain includes mature and younger woodland with open and rough open areas on a steep hillside running down to flat areas of the Thames marshes.
